1. What is your opinion of this vote?

1. We are excited to be the test site for the unveiling of this curriculum, which is a study of the Bible in history and not a "Bible study" class. The Green Scholars Initiative has brought in more than 70 renowned scholars of different faiths from Jerusalem and Oxford to Baylor University to create the curriculum. The list of experts is impressive.

2. How will the Bible course be taught? Will it be an elective or a requirement? Who will teach it?

2. The course is an elective. When our pre-enrollment packets were returned by students earlier this semester, more than 170 students indicated the course would be their first choice for an elective class. There are more than 2,700 students total at Mustang High School in grades 9-12. We have the teacher identified. She's already a certified teacher on staff at Mustang High School.

3. How do you respond to the concerns some have about the course imposing Christianity in a venue meant to be religiously neutral?

3. First, the course is an elective. No student will ever be required to take it. Also, the professors with the Green Scholars Initiative who put together the curriculum come from different personal faith backgrounds, not just Christianity. The Bible is one of the most influential books of all time, permeating through history, regardless of a person's beliefs. It's a part of the phrases and allusions we use in every-day life, a component of classic literature and a building block of many of the country's institutions.
