## Scholarship Summary:

While I continue to research and write in ancient history, for the past decade much of my research has focused on purpose-guided education, especially the role of the humanities in addressing key student success questions in the academy. Three of my recent books deal with this research (McGraw-Hill and Jossey-Bass). I have also given faculty workshops on dozens of campuses, including elite and larger R1s, e.g., Colgate, Univ. of Mich., MSU, Texas A & M, UTEP, etc., and many medium and community colleges, e.g, Santa Barbara Community College, many Ivy Techs, etc. I continue to do a series of national broadcasts for *The Teaching Professor* (Magna). A key scholarly endeavor from my time at the Scriptorium was our virtual program, *The Odyssey in Egypt*. It received an international finalist award along with the Hubble Telescope project and appeared prominently in *U.S. News & W.R.* (11/21/96), and led to two grants for IWU under a *CyberDig* spin off for imbedded assessment.
