TRANSPORTATION

The convention site, the Sheraton Downtown Denver Hotel, and the overflow hotel, The Brown Palace Hotel & Spa, are a 45-minute drive from the Denver International Airport. The A Line Airport Rail (\$10 one way) to Union Station stop takes 37 minutes. Taxis/Uber/Lyft typically cost \$50 minimum. 


